I've just returned from a brief trip to the project to see first hand the chaos caused by the demolition to make way for a road, and by the last moment political decision which impacted schools and destitute areas of the slum.

It's very shocking and sad to see huge swathes of homes gone... thousands made homeless. We are supporting a few families who have lived in their own dwelling there for 40 years, have no money for rent and can't work because of ill health. They have lost everything.

Yet there is optimism in the school despite having no play area and the children squeezed into what remains. Teachers have given their all to continue to care for and teach their classes.

Year 8 - 14 year olds are now sitting the national examinations. Some will excel and we hope it's possible to sponsor those to High School.
